






STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS






DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE






ACADEMIC PROGRESS


Lake Erie Preparatory School increased performance by over 12% and achieved full academic recovery from the pandemic. The school exceeded state expectations for student academic growth (4 Stars, Progress), a two-star increase year-over-year. Additionally, Lake Erie Preparatory School significantly exceeded expectations in gap closing (5 Stars, Gap Closing) and earned an overall rating of 3.5 stars. Over 90% of students met or exceeded expected growth in ELA & Math.
